Trophy Sponsors Needed

As you can see below, we have our first trophy sponsor for Spring Fling, The Precision Valley Corvette Museum, and all it took was a short email to their Director. It's that easy. Now, with a club membership of around 90 people you'd think we'd have no problem getting the sponsors we need, but every year we don't have the sign-ups we should for a club our size.

Here's some interesting facts:

- * Number of sponsors desired: 57 max (we give out 49 sets of 3, and 8 specialty trophies);
- * Actual number sponsors signed up over the past couple of years: Only around 30, and the most was around 38.
- * Because we've haven't had as many sponsors as we'd like, we haven't always been able to give much of a donation to our charities:
- * If we were able to sign up all 57 sponsors for the show, we would be able to pay up all of the show's cost before the first car entrant shows up that Sunday morning.

It's really not hard to get folks to sponsor a trophy. You walk into a shop, store or office of someone you've dealt with over the years and tell them about the event and if they'd like to publicize their business or organization by being a trophy sponsor. Besides they'd also be helping out some of the charities we support. And the sponsors don't have to be auto related either. Other than the usual automotive sponsors I've signed up (auto salvage yard, front-end alignment shop, mechanic's shop), I've found sponsors such as a pharmacy, a smoke shop, a restaurant, and a recruiting agency. And the interesting thing is after you've signed them up once, many of them continue to be sponsors every year with out much prodding, such as the Corvette Museum in Vermont.

You should be receiving your Trophy Sponsor Recruiting packages soon so you can start recruiting some benefactors for our Spring Fling Shine'n'Show at the end of May, and it's never to early to get these folks signed up. This gives them plenty of time to come up with something to put into the goody bag. It also allows us plenty of time to get the name plates made up for the trophies.

OK, OUR CLUB'S GOAL THIS YEAR IS 57 SPONSORS FOR 57 TROPHIES. LET'S GO GET THEM.

Oh yes, I almost forgot. The Corvette Museum will have a special prize for the club member who gets the most sponsors signed up.
