President Larry began the meeting by expressing our appreciation to be back at MacMulkin's for the monthly meeting. A restaurant suggestion for after the meeting was made and a dinner count taken.

Membership Director: John B. introduced Bob and Sheila, potential members with a 2008 atomic orange C6. Other potential members are Jim and Dania with a '66 yellow roadster.

Secretary: Prior to the meeting, Allie sent an email link to the August newsletter containing the most recent secretary's report. They fit in quite well and enjoyed it all. They live in Kingston, NH and maybe are potential members of the club.

I was privileged to be a part of this 2014 NCM Caravan and especially of the NE Region Caravan. Working with Randy was a treat (and sometimes painful) and to see the amount of energy he put into the planning and raising funds to pay for the costs associated with setting it all up, and to donate to the NCM, was well worth the efforts I put into it. I was thrilled to see how great the Route Book turned out and all during the trip folks would comment on how useful it was, and some commented how much they enjoyed the article I wrote about Dan and Karen Gayle. Thank you Randy!!!

At the end, Randy and team were able to donate \$24k to the museum – by purchasing a bench, bricks, and cash donation – largest of the 28 Region teams. The next highest donation was about \$4k.

8-22-14: Departure to Danbury

Heather & I somehow managed to fit two weeks (and a little over) worth of clothes and enough electronics to launch a space shuttle into the back of our 427 Convertible. Years of playing Tetris finally served me well in real life. We had a great cruise down with other Gate City members to Danbury where we met up with others at the hotel.

8-23-14: Lime Rock

Lime Rock was an amazing day, getting to run the small road course autocross was fantastic. I definitely took a bunch of miles off my tires, as I flung the car around the track at a good clip. Was a fun & challenging course to get around, and I learned a lot doing it. The parade laps on the main track were also a blast. I love the large hill elevation change on the back part of that course.



8-24-14: Travel to Gettysburg

Arrived in Gettysburg, PA with our Atomic Orange group, my first day of the caravan running as the official caboose. We watched the Fields of Freedom movie at the theater, and went to the museum afterwards where we talked to re-enactors acting as General Robert E. Lee and his wife. The restored Gettysburg Cyclorama of Pickett's Charge was also a memorable thing to see firsthand.

8-25-14: Summit Point Motorsports Park

Though the day started out foggy, it turned into a great day. Ran my parade laps and enjoyed my time driving on the track, and then got to enjoy *really* going around the track at speed as a passenger with an HPDE instructor in a Z06. Definitely an amazing run to be in the car running at such speeds through the turns. Rt. 33 to Roanoke was also an amazing drive on some incredible twisty roads. Butch and I will never forget that crazy drive, and some of the passes to get around slower moving cars (and school busses).



8-26-14: Lexington and Keeneland Race Track

Another nice day of driving and we found ourselves arriving into bad traffic in Lexington, and long lines to get checked in to the under construction hotel! But the room was serviceable enough for sleeping. A quick detail of the car was needed, and then a trip over to the Keeneland horse racing track, where we got a nice tour of the grounds and buildings before having dinner.

8-27-14 Arrival in Bowling Green

Today we took a bus into Nashville to get a tour around the town. Who knew there was a Parthian replica building in Tennessee? We also got to spend time touring the incredible Gaylord Opryland hotel, and its amazing indoor gardens. After returning to Bowling Green, Heather & I rushed out to make progress on the Civil War Rally. I'll never forget four caravan couples all running around the same graveyard looking for that one elusive headstone "near the big 'ol tree" (hint: There were over a dozen trees, all about the same size) that had moss on it (hint: they ALL had moss on them). 8-30-14 Bowling Green



The last day of the Caravan was a busy one. Up and out early to finish the Civil War Rally, back for the car display, then off to the NCM Motorsports Park to do a few parade laps at the track. Heather & I won the rally, and thankfully the Dan & Gayle offered to take the diorama trophy back to NH for us, since there was NO way it was going in the back of the 427. 8-31-14 Bowling Green and Staging towards the Dragon



We were now on the extended return trip that I had helped organize. We visited Mammoth Cave, driving out there with rain falling from the sky. We were able to do a self-guided tour but they were so busy we couldn't do one of the bigger guided tours. To console ourselves, we then went to Maker's Mark, where we got to do a bit of sampling. 
