Rob Loszewski is a returning member with a red ZR1. Tom Hopkins attended his 1st meeting and has a '79 white coupe.

Secretary: Allie DeCampo asked everyone to continue contributing articles, photos, etc. for the newsletter. The secretary's report was accepted.

Treasurer: Dan Feidler gave a financial update. The Museum has been paid for Gate City's lifetime membership. He announced that he will soon have tickets for a 2015 Stingray to be raffled in September. A motion was carried to accept the treasurer's report. Contact Dan for information about individual membership in the National Corvette Museum.

Officer at Large: John Bosco reminded everyone about the Judging Clinic at 10:00 am on the 17th at Carol and Al's. Vettes of Coastal Maine will be hosting Bar Harbor Tour 2015 May 29th – 31st. The Ice Cream Social at the Veteran's Home in Tilton is planned for June 6^{th.} The MacMulkin Corvette/Camaro Day has been canceled this year. Bloomington Gold is June $25^{\text{th}} - 27^{\text{th}}$.

Vice President/Activities Director: Jim Gorman talked about plans for this year's activities. Please let him know if you would like to help plan activities. He asked everyone to send at least one idea for an activity. He will plan a committee meeting if there is interest.

Veterans Affairs: John Slavin gave an update on the Ice Cream Social planned for June 6th. Larry Goelz will head a caravan from the Hooksett Rest Area on 93 North. Meeting time is 12:45 for 1:00 pm departure. The time of the social is 2:30 pm - 3:45 pm. Volunteers are needed to help park cars and get veterans from their rooms. The club will supply the money for ice cream. Donated items are welcome. (See list for appropriate items on page 20.)

Spring Fling Update: Dean Gagne said that Anheuser Busch is all set. Dan F. will take care of the insurance binder. Goodie bag items are coming in. Trophies will be a light silver; Norm made an executive decision that the white didn't look good. The dash plagues have been ordered and they are white and gold 3x3s. Richie O. is set up as DJ. Heather is working on a pamphlet and the deadline for entries is the 17^{th.} Feather flags will not be ordered at this time. Trophy sponsors are coming in but more are needed. Dean is still waiting for the town of Merrimack to provide final information on vendor fees. He has supplies for getting the parking lot ready. Members are asked to bring a few pop up tents. He explained that the parking lay-out is done the evening before. A few people are needed to help out at 4:00 pm on the 23^{rd} .

Pizza will be provided for members after the show by the same vendor as last year. We will need to buy water and soda. Jim and Dani will bring a large cooler and bags of ice. Heather will pick up coffee and donuts for the morning.

Jill is coordinator for the penny table raffle and raffle table (more expensive items.) She needs volunteers to help with running the tables. Donated items will be accepted. Please bring items to the judging clinic or let Jill know in advance what you plan to bring. Norm and Dan will bring the trophies and goodie bags on Friday.

2015 NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM BASH

This was our third NCM Bash and the best to so far. Each Bash we have attended has had a dual purpose. First to attend the Bash, but also to run the 2019 NE Caravan route, to map the routing details, and to meet with the hotels to continue to work out the details relating to the hotels hosting the NE Caravan and its various events.

Although 2019 seems far away, for those of us who have committed to be on the NE 2019 Caravan team, the timing seems "short" as we know what has to be done in the time allocated. Our initial gathering point will be Gettysburg, PA at the Wyndham Hotel (at least that is the current plan – most hotels will not commit so far out). This starting point was selected as about half of the Caravan attendees are expected to be at Corvettes of Carlisle and will not have to change hotels to participate in the opening celebrations.

Ingrid and I met up with Randy and Judy at the Wyndham on Sunday 19 April, discussed our travel plans, had dinner at the hotel and retired for the evening.

The next morning, after breakfast, we headed out on our proposed route for 2019. We headed for Port Royal, VA where we picked up the Skyline Drive (if you have a National Parks pass there is no charge for running the Sky Line). It is a great run and around lunch time there is a great Parks Restaurant that had a quite good menu of which we enjoyed. The parking is sufficient for Corvettes.

After lunch we continued on and exited at Rt. 33 in WV (this is the eastern side of the Rt. 33 we took on the 2014 Caravan heading west where the road was very winding and elevated). We headed west to pick up I-81 heading south to Natural Bridge, VA. We were staying at the Natural Bridge Hotel which we were looking at as a stopping point on the 2019 Caravan. As we were 2 miles from the hotel we had a down pour (thankfully no hail) but arrived safely. '

After checking into the hotel (slow process), we put our things in our rooms and met with the Sales department to discuss our needs for 2019. We had a tour of the hotel (which is under renovation) and all its facilities.



After wards, we dinned in the hotel restaurant and reviewed what we learned. After dinner we attended the Creation Story, put on by the hotel, under the Natural Bridge. Then off to bed and Bristol Motor Speedway in the morning.



Although there were many positives, we felt that the check in process was quite lengthy, and there was only one elevator (and it was slow!). It was an enjoyable stay for us but with 225 people it might end up a night mare. Next we will look at Roanoke, VA.

After breakfast we headed out on I-81 for Roanoke to check out The Roanoke Hotel and Conference Center in downtown that Randy thought may work. We got to the hotel and found the parking to be a public lot and a ways from the hotel. The hotel was quite grand with more amenities than we could expect. The check in area could only handle about 12 cars at a time which could prove challenging. So, we scratched this one off and headed out for Bristol Motor Speedway.

We arrived at Bristol Motor Speedway around 1 PM and walked around the facilities. The day before Bristol hosted the Sprint Cup race. It is quite a facility given it is a half mile track. After viewing the track we headed out for Meadow View Conference Resort and Convention Center, in Kingsport, TN. We grabbed a late lunch, toured the resort and found it to our liking and that it would work for a Caravan stopping point – assuming acceptable pricing can be obtained. We dined at the resorts restaurant.

The next day we headed for Bowling Green via Nashville. It was about a 6 hour ride. Arriving at the Holiday Inn-University Plaza, we checked in, through our bags into the room, then headed to the museum to get our Bash registration materials.

For the evening, Randy and Judy had to be at the museum so Ingrid and I went downtown to the Brickyard Café for dinner then back to the hotel where we met Randy and Judy for cocktails.

On Thursday we went to the museum to look around then joined a group of about 20 cars for a cruise to Portsmouth, TN for lunch at the 5 Chef's Restaurant. We took the slow route back to Bowling Green then went to the NCM Motor Sports Park for a Meet and Greet where the museum put on a BBQ for the

attendees. After getting back at the hotel, we went to the lounge, enjoyed cocktails with Randy and Judy, and then retired for the evening.

On Friday the museum had the 2016 Unveiling which we attended. We had presentations from Jeff LaMarche, Plant Manager, Tage Juechter, Corvette Chief Engineer, Ryan Vaughn, Interior Design Manager and Harlan Charles, Corvette Production Manager. Of note, the plant is at maximum capacity of 170 cars per day, they exceeded their build schedule for the 1st quarter, ordering for 2016 started on 4/27 with orders being booked in mid-May. Currently there is no pricing for the 2016 models.

There is new Z06 C7.R special edition (only 500 will be produced) which is pictured below in the new yellow color. There are 4 chassis packages for the Stingray, updated navigation systems, a new Z06 Blade Wheel, and Crystal red is replaced by Long Beach Red.

There will be three new design packages for the Z06. One order number gets the whole package. There is the Twilight Blue package, the Spice Red package, and the Black Suede package. Below is the Twilight Blue package.

There are new two tone seats, accent stitching and colors for the interiors. Production is scheduled to begin at the end of June or early July. This will be a rolling change over so there will not be 2 week shut down. Order guides were being sent to dealerships the week following the Bash, and pricing was not available.

Our Travel Guide said that he did not realize we were a group of 8 (he had us as a group of 4). After some time, they provided a van to take us to Dreams. We loaded aboard and cruised the new highway (finished several years ago – before the highway the trip took 1.5 hours, now it takes 45 minutes) and arrived at the Dreams around 1 PM.
