

A Hidden Gem of an Auto Museum

Over spring break, Deb and I took a trip to Phoenix, AZ to visit family and friends. We were looking for something else to do with my brother and his wife and the Martin Auto Museum was suggested by my brother. I had the museum on my Google list of places to visit, so of course I said yes.


The Martin Auto Museum is located along I-17 N, also known as Black Canyon Highway. It is in an unassuming warehouse style building with very little ornamentation. We walk in and expect to have to pay admission, but they don't charge admission, rather they suggest a donation of \$10 per adult. We walk from room to room only to discover there is another room to explore. There is also a lot of automotive memorabilia. You can see some of it in the backgrounds of the pictures.

The first car you see when entering is a 1967 Corvette convertible cut-away car.



Next to it is a 1992 Lister Corvette design study. It is one of only 2 known to exist and was done to see what a Corvette could look like if it was designed by Ferrari.





Several more Corvettes sit in a line next to the Lister, here's one example, plus one for the future Corvette owner:






My favorite car in the collection was the 1930 Duesenberg Boattail Speedster. It is a beautiful car, and check out that engine, wow! "This Duesenberg was originally owned by John Factor, one of Chicago's most elusive gangsters. John was half-brother to the famous cosmetics giant Max Factor. Although he worked for Al Capone and had a scandalous past, John was often seen handing out food to the less fortunate from the back of this vehicle."

We learned that Doris Duke was the driving force behind The Newport Restoration Foundation and responsible for saving and restoring many of Newport's fine historical homes.

A visit to Fort Adams and the Volvo Race Village was planned for Friday afternoon; however, we opted to take a shuttle for shopping and lunch in the village. Later that evening Joe and Carol braved the cold to participate in the 12 meter sail.
