

Treasurer: Dean Gagne presented the treasurer's report. The report was accepted by the membership. He gave an update on charitable donations to the Nashua Soup Kitchen and Adopt-a-Family. He will email his report to the membership and post in the members' only section of our website.

Secretary: Allie DeCampo posted minutes from the last meeting in the newsletter. The minutes were accepted by the membership. Allie thanked everyone who sent articles and photos for the September newsletter.

Vice President/Activities Director: Larry Shields stated that the club has done 14 cruises this season. He encouraged members to share ideas for future cruises.

Vettes to Vets is scheduled for September 29th in Bedford, MA. Meeting place is Kohl's parking lot to caravan to the Marriot Hotel in Billerica, MA. Breakfast is available at the hotel. There will be a brief drivers' meeting before heading over to the Veteran's Hospital. This event grows every year...last year there were over 600 cars. Donations go directly to the veterans.

Dennis mentioned that next year is the 45th anniversary of GCCC. He suggested we plan a special celebration.

Holiday Party: Claudia Feidler announced that the Holiday Party will be held on January 18th at the Puritan Event Center. A discussion followed regarding the number of expected guests, the size of the function room needed, and the total cost of the party. The decision was made to reserve the larger function room. The cost will be \$50.00 per person...half will be returned the night of the event to those who attend. Payment is due by December 15th. As usual, we will plan to have a Yankee Swap. Claudia asked if there was any interest in entertainment such as a hypnotist or magician.

National Corvette Museum: Dan Feidler encouraged everyone to join the NCM. Please let Dan know if you do sign up as he gets credit. Contact Dan if you are considering joining or have questions about the museum.

NCM Corvette Caravan: Larry Goelz gave his final report on the New England Caravan. There were 217 cars from NE – 420 people participating. Due to the generosity of participants, the NE Caravan was able to make substantial cash donations to the Museum. In addition, the NE caravan donated a bench, banner, bricks, and also paid for the Hall of Fame dinner. Leading up to the Caravan, there were 5 meet & greets, as well as sales of clothing, blankets, jewelry, and raffle tickets. Organizing this event was a huge undertaking to say the least! Thanks to Randy Flock and all the state leaders (including Larry and Ingrid Goelz) for their

amazing work. The next caravan in 5 years will need new leadership as Randy is stepping down from his position of captain. (Big shoes to fill!) There will be a NE Caravan reunion at Loon Mountain in 2020.

Larry Goelz thanked Larry Shields for planning the return trip from Bowling Green.

Factory allocations for the C8 have begun. UAW may go on strike. If so, production could be delayed.

Joe Michalik asked that thoughtful consideration be given to the content of mass emails before sending out to the membership.

I neglected to record who won the 50/50 raffle. I will update my report if someone can fill me in. The winner of the membership raffle (\$10.00) was Allie DeCampo.

Dennis adjourned the meeting at 8:00 pm.
