MUSCLE CAR CITY MUSEUM CLOSES ITS DOORS

Rick Treworgy's Muscle Car City museum closed its doors on January 17, 2021. Mr. Treworgy had intended to close the museum and retire next year, but the pandemic of 2020 hastened that date. On January 22nd and 23rd, Mecum Auctions sold off the museum's considerable automobilia collection and some of the finest GM muscle cars ever built, many with extraordinary selling prices.

Corvettes were another passion for Rick Treworgy, and there were nearly 50 up for grabs. Every generation was represented, including the 2020 C8 in Torch Red over Adrenaline Red/Ebony interior, with 3LT option package, showing a scant 194 miles on the clock, that found new ownership for well above sticker at \$121,000. A rare Tuxedo Black over red vinyl L89 (one of only 624 built), four-speed convertible sold for a staggering \$209,000, more than \$50,000 above market value. To be fair, the color combo was gorgeous, and the options meant this may be a one of just a few, or maybe even oneof-one.

Don't feel bad for Rick Treworgy selling off his museum full of cars. He still has a great private collection at his home, including more than 20 1967 Corvettes.

CORVETTE RAGS TO RICHES

The story of the '59

Carol and I bought our '59 Corvette from an ad in the "Want Ad" magazine in summer of 2000. At the time, I was planning to build the '59 as a driver, but I have a hard time just doing that. I ended up working many nights and weekends for about one and a half years from beginning to completion.

As you can imagine, there's a bit of a story behind this. We went to look at the car in Methuen, Mass. The guy selling it was a character and well known in the area. The first thing we saw upon entering his huge garage was a blow up doll! Seeing this, I thought he might be a little weird but it was just a joke and he was really an ok guy.

He was asking \$25,000 for the car with about 8K worth of parts included. After working the price down to \$22,000, we had a deal...a really great deal but one with a catch. It had to be cash that day! What? Today! You're kidding, right? Ok, we do not have 22K in the bank so what do we do? The unthinkable, stand in line at the bank and draw our account nearly empty for 12K and put 10K on the MasterCard (this was max). We left the bank with \$22,000 cash in a bag and proceeded to meet with the seller to complete the transaction.

It took 3 trips with the truck to bring home the parts along with the back half of a '62 Corvette salvaged car. The seller had been friends with the owner of Ferries Auto in Methuen, a huge Corvette salvage yard with a lot of valuable parts. When the salvage yard went out of business, he had acquired their entire parts inventory. Now I needed to sell off all of those extra parts before the MasterCard interest ruined what had been a great deal. Fortunately, the parts sold quickly so it wasn't long before the MasterCard was completely paid off. It did take 3 transmissions, a motor, and rear differential to get the car the way I wanted it.

The Corvette is a 283 CI 245 HP with 2X4 carburetors. Transmission is an original close ratio Borg Warner T-10 4 speed. Rear end is the original 370-1 positraction. The car is painted in an original Inca Silver color with Snowcrest White insert. It is a base coat/clear coat Dupont ChromaBase paint.


This was the last body off the frame restoration I did for myself. There have been many more cars but none were full restorations. In the past, I owned a small restoration shop in Haverhill, Mass. for about 10 years, and we





displayed my finished frames in the main aisle of the Nashua mall. In those days, I did quite a few cars for club members, as well.

The '59 was a winner from the beginning right through. We have taken this Corvette everywhere including the Rhode Island show, Castle in the Clouds, Great Bay, etc. We take it up the coast at least once a year. It has become kind of a staple in the club. This was a scary move for us at the time, but one well worth it in the end!

COVERED BRIDGES OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Hi Everyone,



Well, here is covered bridge #1 in our quest to gather information about New Hampshire's covered bridges. As it was snowing in the afternoon on January 21st, Sue and I set out to find the Baboosic Brook Covered Bridge on Stowell Road in Merrimack.

Sue found the bridge listed on a map of New Hampshire covered bridges. We were intrigued as we both grew up in Manchester and Bedford, towns just down the road from Merrimack, and with all our travels over the years we had never heard of such a bridge. We also summered for almost 10 years with our boys at Baboosic Lake so we were often out and about on the area back roads. We pulled up Waze and punched in Baboosic Brook Covered Bridge and hit start. It was listed as 16 minutes from our home!

The covered bridge is super easy to find and goes through a nice housing development if you enter from Route 101. You end up at the bridge surrounded in what feels like a private New England farm, nice home with barn and fields across the road with the bridge going through the property. It must be sweet in the fall with the foliage. We were able to pull off the road next to a beautiful stone wall and walk to the bridge. Afterwards, we crossed the one lane bridge and headed home. If you live in the area, it's just a short drive and the road is in good condition.

This could be a possible drive for the club; however, we have many more older and larger bridges to research with longer driving distances. Below is information we found when we got home and researched the Baboosic Brook Bridge on Google.

Stowell Road (Baboosic Brook) Covered Bridge Merrimack, New Hampshire

The Stowell Road covered bridge spanning the Baboosic Brook was delivered to New Hampshire in the form of a kit from companies in Michigan and Minnesota and built in 1990. It is one of the few covered bridges in the southern part of the state. The bridge is easy to get to but parking and photo opportunities are not the best as it is surrounded by private property and a public road open to traffic.


