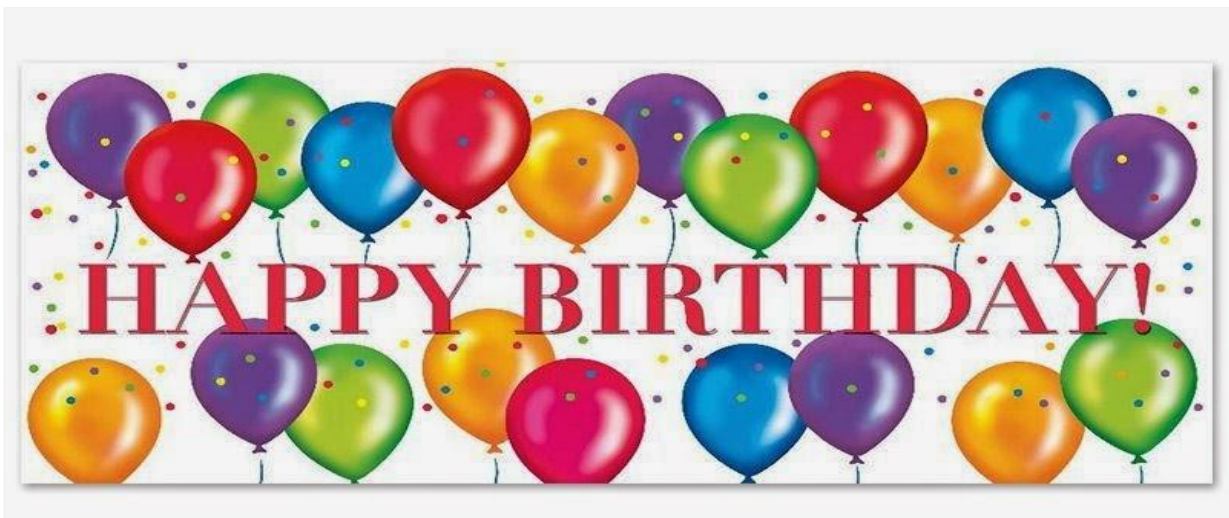

# Thirty Years and Counting

The beginnings of the National Corvette Museum started in 1984 at an NCRS annual meeting where a presentation was made to have a not-for-profit foundation to collect Corvette-relative materials into a common library or archives, and to be separate from the NCRS. In 1988 the NCRS BOD approved the plan to implement the NCRS Foundation.



In 1989 memberships were offered, and in 1990 it was renamed the NCM Foundation and the NCM Annex (mainly a gift shop) opened in Bowling Green, Kentucky in November. The National Corvette Museum officially held its grand opening on September 2 – 5, 1994.

The original memberships offered were Founding Member, Charter Member, Supporting Member, and Lifetime Member. The first 30 Founding Memberships were reserved with numbers 1 - 25 for notable people like Zora, Bill Mitchell, etc. and 26 – 30 for the original founders. Membership cards for the Founding members were a gold-colored metal card, and for the Charter members it was a silver-colored metal card. Both the Founding membership and Charter memberships came with the membership card and a certificate signed by either Zora Arkus-Duntov, David McLellan, or Larry Shinoda. NOTE: Some Corvette enthusiasts that many of us know are Founding Members – Karen Blandini (#29), and Randy Flock who became a Founding Member in January 1992.

Over time membership offerings evolved where today the offerings include Individual Member, Family Membership, Senior Individual Membership, Lifetime Membership, Business/Club Membership, Next Generation Member, and Lifetime Business/Club Membership.

On August 20, 1991, 3 years plus prior to the grand opening of the NCM, Gate City Corvette Club, understanding the importance of the effort to establish a Corvette Museum and Archive, became a Founding Member of the National Corvette Museum. I believe all current members of Gate City Corvette Club should take pride in the fact that our club was in a small way instrumental in supporting the effort to establish the Museum and pride in our early members who understood the NCRS vision and helped make it a reality.

On March 9, 2015 Gate City Corvette Club became a Lifetime Member #3009. Again, this showed that the members continue to see the value of continuing to support the NCM and of the museum's programs and visions. One of the benefits of the Lifetime Membership is the club has 2 museum passes for use by any member. If you will be going to the NCM, and you are not a NCM member, contact Dean Gagne to find out how to use the club pass. I would strongly suggest that while at the museum you sign



up for membership! You will not regret it and you will be joining many of other club members who are NCM members.

So, come this August 20th, Gate City Corvette Club will celebrate being a member of the National Corvette Museum for 30 years.

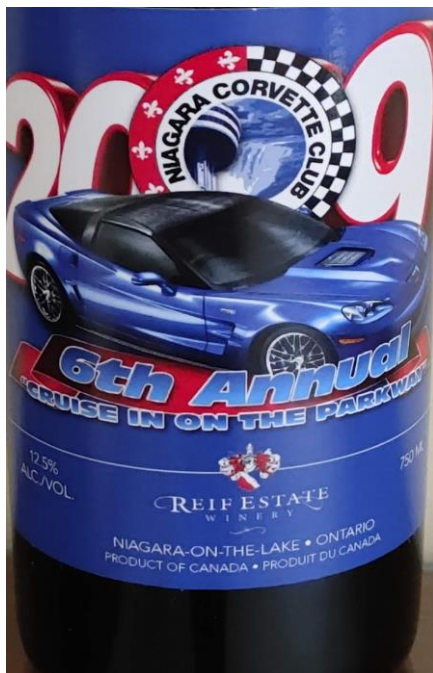


Fig 5 Corvette Wine Label

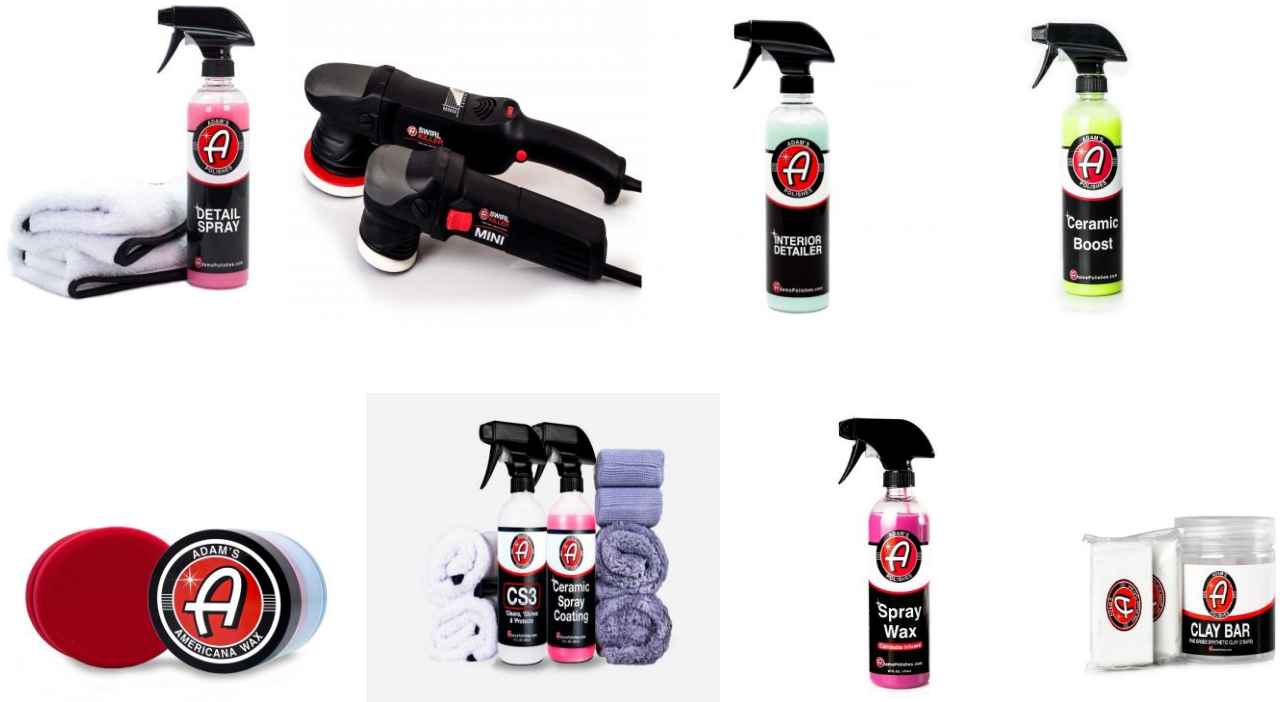
