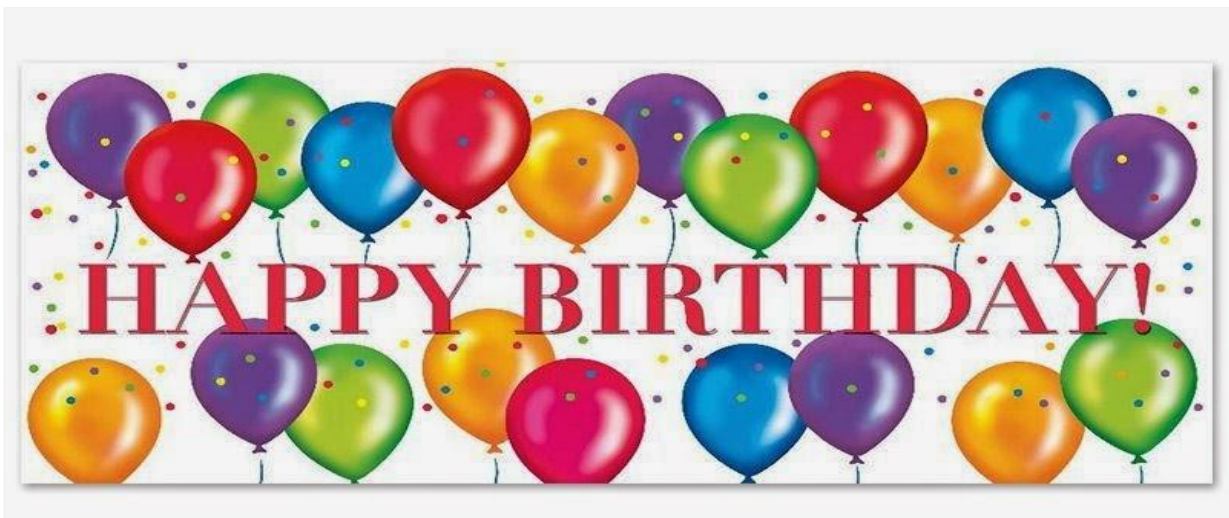

Almost There But Not Quite!

Many of you know that Ingrid and I have a 1974 Alfa Romeo Spider which was purchased at the Owls Head Transportation Museum in 2009. Since owning it we have had some work done on the “important” aspects of the vehicle such as engine head replacement. All along I had wanted to have some restoration work done on the interior. In the early fall of 2020, I dropped the vehicle off at Veloce Imports to have the interior redone – dash, console, etc. There were also some other items needing attention – replace heater core, rerun speakers wiring for the radio, install new speakers, rubber floor mats, and some paint work.

Time passed and I was notified that I could pick up the car (end of July). This was good news as the summer was rapidly slipping away and I wanted to have the Alfa to enjoy. On a Friday morning Ingrid and I went to pick up the car. I discussed the work done with the shop owner and Ingrid left for home. Sometime later I also departed for home.

On I-293 in Manchester as I was passing the Mall of NH, the accelerator had no response and it seemed the engine quit, but the tach showed RPM's so I figured the accelerator linkage had an issue. I was now just at the Brown Ave. exit so I took it and parked on the exit ramp. I then called the shop to let them know what happened and was told the owner would be on his way to rescue me.

As I looked in the engine bay, I found one end of the linkage but could not find the other end so I called the shop back and explained what I had found. The owner said he would bring some parts with him. He arrived about 20 minutes later, looked at the situation, found the other end and proceeded to make a repair. He said the parts were worn but should hold together to get home.

I departed heading into Manchester via Brown Avenue then picked up Elm Street. Approaching the intersection of Elm St. and Queen City Ave., the throttle again had no response. Not wanting to be stuck at the intersection, I let out the clutch easily and the car moved very slowly through the intersection and I then parked the car halfway onto the Queen City Bridge curb/sidewalk.

Again, I called the shop and explained the situation. I was told that the towing company they used would contact me to pick up the car. It was lunch time when the towing company called and informed me that it would be another 30 minutes before someone would return from lunch and contact me. After one hour the towing company called. I told the caller where I was located and he said he would be there in about fifteen minutes. I then called Ingrid and told her what was happening and where she should meet me. The tow truck showed up after 20 minutes and the driver put the car on the truck and left. By now Ingrid was parked across the street and we headed for home.

Earlier that morning I had left to pick up the Alf at 9 AM and after everything I got home at 3 PM. Interestingly enough, of all the work done on the Alfa for the past 8 months none of it touched the linkage – it was old and finally failed! What is next – we will see!

Oh, the interior restoration is looking good and the paint touch up was well done, but there are some issues that still need to be addressed. Welcome to the world of old vehicles and restoration work.

I still love the Pagoda Yellow Alfa and it is a joy to drive!!!

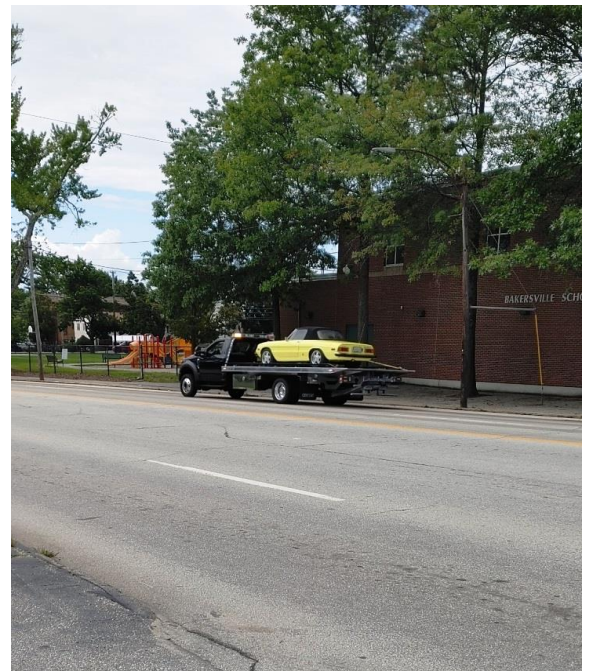


Figure 4 Heading Back to the Shop

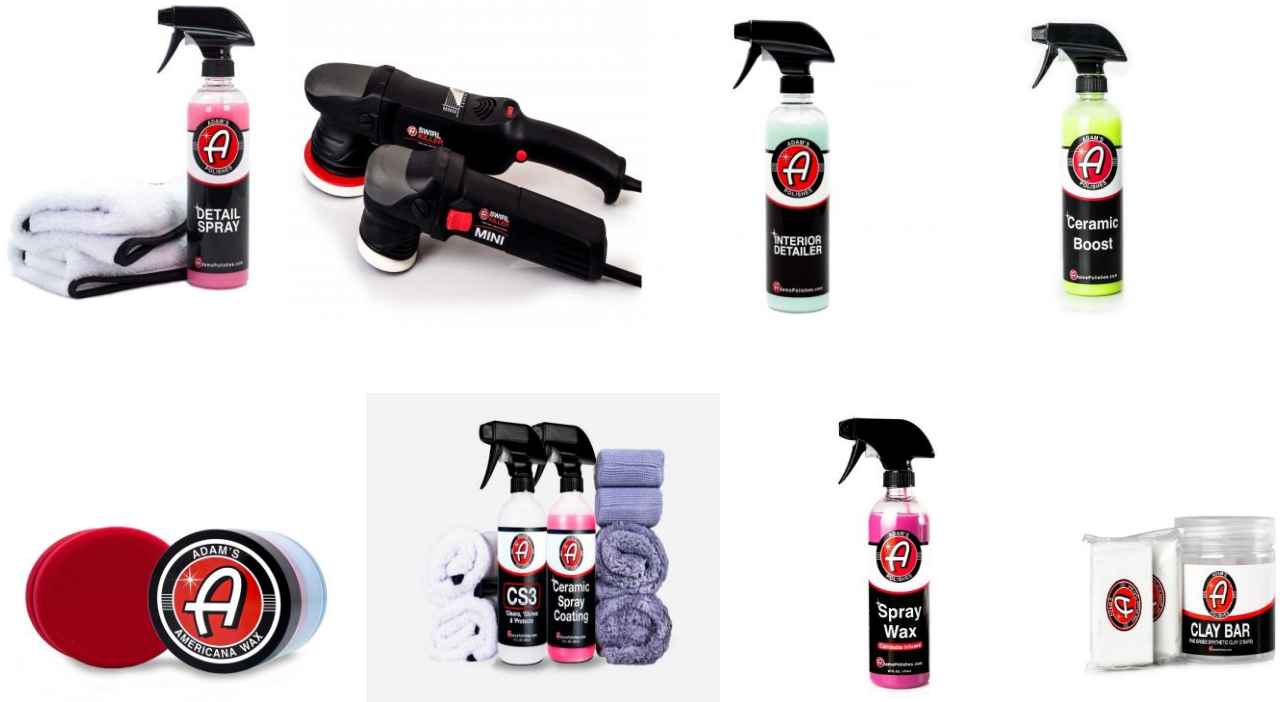
