- NCM announced 2024 Caravan "Over all Captain" Frank Sancineto of Queen City Corvettes
- NE Caravan Planning Update:
  - O All States/E. Canada have leaders except Vermont
  - O The logo designs are complete
  - O Clothing has been received and available for sale; current items include denim shirts, polo shirts, and jackets, t-shirts will be available at a later date.
  - O NE Caravan routes have been laid out.
  - O All hotels have been contracted with Wyndham Hotel in Gettysburg, Hotel Roanoke in Roanoke, VA, Embassy Suites in Concord, NC, Meadowview Resort in Kingsport, TN, and the Holiday Inn in Bowling Green, KY.
  - O Events for each leg of the trip have been identified.
  - O Two Meet and Greets are in the planning stages first one will be in Hyannis, MA on October 20 23, 2022, the second will be in the Finger Lakes Region in the Fall of 2023.
  - O The first team leaders meeting were held on 10 September.
  - O 2024 NE Caravan Registration will OPEN on 14 February 2022, Valentine Day!
  - O The kick-off for the Caravan will be in Gettysburg, PA, at the Wyndham Hotel (starting on Thursday 22 August; 2-day minimum stay), departing on Sunday 25 August for Hotel Roanoke in Roanoke, VA (driving on part of the Blue Ridge Parkway), departing on Monday 26 August, the plan is to go to the Virginia International Speedway for track time and lunch, then on to the Embassy Suites Hotel in Concord, NC, departing on 27 August for the Meadowview Resort in Kingsport, TN, departing on 28 August for the Holiday Inn (4 day minimum stay) in Bowling Green, KY, departing on 1 September for Home.

# Board of Directors Election

November is the month we hold elections for Club officers. #### Article VII

#### Section 1 - Number of Officers

The elected officers of the Club shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Officer-at-Large, and Membership Director. They shall each serve for one (1) year or until their successors are elected and qualified. No officer shall serve more than two (2) consecutive years in the same office. The Board of Directors will be comprised of the elected officers, appointed members and the immediate past President who will serve a one-year term.

#### Section 2 – Nominations

Nominations for all officer positions will be taken from the floor during the regular monthly meeting in September and October. Any member of the Club wishing to run for office should notify the President or any member of the nominating committee to insure their name is placed in nomination. Any member applying for the position of Treasurer shall be a member in good standing of this Club for a minimum of four (4) years or as otherwise determined by the Board of Directors. The names of all nominees shall be published in the October and November newsletters.

#### Section 3 - Election of Officers

Election of officers shall be held at the annual meeting in November. Nominations, in addition to those already published will be considered from the floor. All officers shall be elected by majority vote. Members in good standing wishing to vote by absentee ballot shall request same from the Secretary and return same to the Secretary prior to the election meeting.

All positions are available for nomination, so if one of the positions is of interest to you and you can make the commitment to the Club, please contact a member of the Election Committee with the position you are interested in.

We need your response by 10/15 so that the ballots can be created and included in the newsletter. If you have any questions, please contact a member of the Election Committee or one of the current officers.

Starting at the Bedford Market Basket, traveling northwest through the beautiful towns of Henniker, Hillsboro, Gilsum, Alstead, North Walpole and on to Rockingham, VT where we will visit the famous Vermont Country Store. Travel time is approximately two hours and travelling distance is about 94 miles.
