### My Corvette Story

Hi! My name is Mitch and my love for Corvettes started when I was a teenager with a license. My family had a '69 Mustang fastback which if I cleaned it I was allowed to drive it. As much as this was a thrill to drive, the Corvette was the real American sports car of the time. The C2 1967 427 cubic inch Corvette coupe was the machine to own. In 1969, I had a friend on my street in Auburn, MA who owned one. I knew this was not in my reach. I settled for a '65 GTO convertible for \$700 which I wish I still owned. My first Corvette was a C5 2001 5.7 liter convertible purchased in 2010 and sold



7 years later in 2017. I loved this car but still was yearning for a C2 Corvette, the beginning of the American sports car. In the fall of 2021, I searched eBay and other online sites for the car of my teens. On September 9, 2021, I found and purchased on eBay the 1967 Corvette convertible black L79 350hp 4 speed manual of my dreams. The seller was a private party located in Riverview, Michigan. This car was a frame on restoration with much care taken except for some interior work which I completed in the winter of 2021 with the help of Jeff's Lex-Toy in Londonderry, NH. I found and bought the parts and Jeff installed what was needed. I did some of the repairs myself to quicken the process of completion.





# WHICH C8 CORVETTE OPTIONS ARE MOST POPULAR?



When it came time to order a 2022 Chevrolet Corvette, nearly half of the buyers opted for the convertible. According to a breakdown from the automaker, 52 percent of the sports cars' production was the coupe, and droptop was 48 percent of the volume.

Corvette convertible buyers preferred a vehicle with lots of amenities compared to coupe customers. For example, 52 percent of the droptops were the range-topping 3LT trim level, versus 33 percent for the coupe.

Of the folks who ordered the convertible, 37 percent of them opted for the D84 option, which paints the roof and nacelles in the shade Carbon Flash. Only 9 percent checked the box for the D86 option, which makes the nacelles Carbon Flash but leaves the roof in body color.

For the coupe, 79 percent of buyers went with the body-colored painted roof. The second most popular option was the 10 percent of folks who ordered the transparent panel.

The performance exhaust, which has option code NPP, is very popular with Corvette customers. It lifts the engine's output to 5 horsepower to take the output to 495 hp (369 kilowatts). The take rate for the pipes was 87 percent.

2022 Corvette buyers had a preference for the Z51 Performance Package with the MagneRide suspension with Performance Traction Management because 46 percent of orders had this sophisticated chassis system. A further 23 percent of customers got the Z51 pack with the regular version of the MagneRide tech.

Chevy is now taking orders for the 2023 Chevrolet Corvette Stingray. There are several new options like black exhaust tips for and aluminum interior trim. The additional wheel choices include Gloss Black, Satin Black with red stripes, Ultra-Bright Machined, and Tech Bronze.

Later in the 2023 model year, the much-anticipate Corvette Z06 will join the lineup.

# **National Corvette Museum Bash 2022**

### Planning the route for the New England Caravan 2024

Each year we attend both the NCM Bash and the NCM Anniversary Celebration and travel the route we are planning for the next New England Region Corvette Caravan to Bowling Green. This allows us to make sure the route is as expected, there are no impediments, and our planned timing is correct. We also check the route for construction and any unexpected changes overall.

The Bash occurs at the end of April or early May and runs for three days. This time our trip began on 23 May. We headed for Scranton, PA, where we met up with Kevin and Georgia LeBlond, the 2024 NE Caravan State Leaders for NH/VT. We enjoyed dinner at the Harvest Seasonal Grill and discussed the route we would be taking to Bowling Green.

On Sunday, we headed for Gettysburg, PA and the Wyndham Hotel where we would meet up with Randy Flock. On the way, we took some side roads and enjoyed the apple orchards in bloom. Upon arrival we discovered that the brew pub next to the Wyndham Hotel where we have enjoyed many lunches was closed for good. In addition, the hotel restaurant was only open a few days of a week due to lack of staff. Since we all had time before Randy arrived, Kevin and Georgia went to tour the battlefields and Ingrid and I decided to go to the Plain and Fancy Restaurant which was on our itinerary for the Caravan. Randy also checked out the Plain and Fancy and, after discussing our needs with the manager, decided it would not work. He found a replacement restaurant, Millers Smorgasbord, in the same area. That evening we found a small Italian restaurant for dinner and discussed the next day's route.

On Monday morning, we searched for a restaurant since the one at the hotel was closed for breakfast. We went to several local eateries and found them all closed so we headed out on our route and located a diner about a half hour away. After breakfast we went down I-81 to Lexington to the Virginia Military Institute which we felt would be an interesting attraction for Caravan as it has an outstanding museum. We were unable to find

suitable parking space, so we removed it from our list of Caravan attractions. In our attempt to find a lunch place we found the Devils Backbone Brewery and Restaurant just off the I-81 exit for Lexington. We decided to add it as a lunch stop on our Caravan route.

Next we went to Buena Vista to get onto the Blue Ridge Parkway heading south for Roanoke, VA. We had a brisk run as there was little traffic, but then had to get off as the parkway was closed part way down. We made our way to the Hotel Roanoke and were able to leave the cars in the arrival area so no one would "disturb them" and at no charge! We had dinner at the hotel's restaurant.

On Tuesday we had breakfast at the hotel them headed out for Virginia International Raceway. At the track we connected with the person who handles the scheduling and came up with a package for doing that track for the Caravan. From there we headed for Concord, NC and checked in at the Embassy Suites. Afterwards, we

Wednesday had us traveling to the Meadowview Resort in Kingsport, TN. Kevin took the lead and picked a local BBQ place to stop for lunch. The Meadowview Resort was the same as we remembered; however, they were also short of help.

Thursday, we had breakfast at the hotel and discussed the route to Bowling Green. Randy cited the traffic issues when passing through Knoxville and Nashville and suggested we look for an alternate route. After some discussion, it was decided to try heading north and then cross-country to Bowling Green. This route proved to be the same travel time, less miles and less interstate driving so we decided to use it on the 2024 Caravan. We arrived in Bowling Green in the afternoon, stopped at the NCM to pick up our registration packages then proceeded to the Holiday Inn. Later we all met at the Montana Grill for great steaks and conversation.

Friday, we toured the NCM, viewed the vendor displays, and looked over the 2023 Z06. There was a cutaway of both the vehicle and the engine. Employees from the plant were there to answer questions about the vehicles on display. Afterwards we journeyed to Portland, TN to have lunch at the 5 Chefs restaurant and then returned to Bowling Green to attend the Winners Circle Awards Banquet at the museum.
