





Looks like a whole lot of pasta!

Pampered Chef S'more Cups

Ingredients:

7 whole graham crackers (1 cup/250 mL finely crushed)

1/4 cup (50 mL) powdered sugar

6 tbsp (90 mL) butter, melted

4 bars (1.55 oz or 43 g each) milk chocolate candy, divided

12 large marshmallows

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350°F (180°C).



- 1. Place graham crackers into a large resealable plastic bag. Finely crush into crumbs using Baker's Roller®. Combine graham cracker crumbs, powdered sugar and butter in Small Batter Bowl. Using Small Scoop, place scant scoop of crumb mixture in each cup of Deluxe Mini-Muffin Pan. Press crumbs to form shallow cups with Mini-Tart Shaper. Bake 4-5 minutes or until edges are bubbling.
- 2. Meanwhile, break two of the candy bars into rectangles. Remove pan from oven; place one rectangle into each cup.
- 3. Cut marshmallows in half crosswise using Professional Shears dipped in cold water. Place one marshmallow half, cut-side down, into each cup. Return to oven 1-2 minutes or until marshmallows are just slightly softened. Remove from oven to Stackable Cooling Rack; cool 15 minutes. Carefully remove cups from pan. Cool completely.
- 4. Break remaining candy bars and place in (1-cup/250 mL) Prep Bowl. Microwave on HIGH 1-1 1/2 minutes or until melted and smooth, stirring every 20 seconds. Dip the top of each marshmallow in melted chocolate. Turn top-side up and let stand 40 minutes-1 hour or until set.

Yield: 24 servings of 1 cup Nutrients per serving: Calories 100, Total Fat 6 g, Saturated Fat 3.5 g, Cholesterol 10 mg, Carbohydrate 11 g, Protein 1 g, Sodium 60 mg, Fiber 0 g U.S. Diabetic exchanges per serving: 1 starch, 1 fat (1 carb)

Cook's Tips: Dipping the Professional Shears in cold water before cutting the marshmallows helps minimize sticking. The time it takes the chocolate to set varies depending on weather conditions and room temperature. You can refrigerate the cups briefly until the chocolate is set; store them at room temperature. Store the cups in a single layer in an airtight container for up to 1 week. Freezing is not recommended. For a richer chocolate flavor, substitute dark chocolate candy bars for the milk chocolate.



Ambassador's NCM Update

August 2022

As the GCCC Ambassador, I have goals to meet for the NCM. For me to meet the goals I need each of you to **let me know** if you attend a museum event, purchase memberships, purchase raffle tickets, purchase bricks/tiles/bench, or make donations to the museum.

Artifact of the Month: Each month the NCM Curatorial staff selects an artifact from their collection that is connected to a significant moment in Corvette history and share its story with you. This month is "**Reinventing the Wheel**" https://www.corvettemuseum.org/reinventing-the-wheel/.



For the September Artifac of the Month, the aspects of re-designing the wheel are reviewed. After sketches are drawn, images rendered, printed, sculpted, modified, scanned, evaluated and refined, each part of your car becomes a three-dimensional "document" called a Design Quality Prove Out Model that needs to be signed off before production.



Coming new exhibit will feature Corvette's Vice Presidents of Design beginning with Harley Earl in the 1950s through Mike Simcoe today. The exhibit will also reveal the lesser-known stories of those who worked out of the spotlight but were no less influential in creating the lines that would shape the auto industry. Additionally, this exhibit shines a light on the diversity of the individuals responsible for Corvette's iconic design. This exhibit also provides a full overview of the intricate and exciting process of designing a car, from sketches and renderings to clay and prove-out models.

Corvette Trivia Answer - most valuable Corvette race car...

First, we have to discuss what happened in 1955 at the 24 hour Lemans. A Mercedes 300 SLR exploded killing 83 spectators. The Automotive Manufacturers Association (AMA) declared a ban on racing and GM agreed. GM was in fear of an anti-trust law suit by Robert Kennedy against the Company. Common sense says the faster the car the more enthusiasts want to buy it and more profit is the result. In 1963, Zora Arkus-Duntov, the godfather of the Corvette acted as a privateer and developed the Corvette Grand Sport light weight version of the aluminum block with a 377 cubic inch motor putting out 550 hp with a plan to build 125 vehicles. This project was halted by GM management and the AMA racing ban at 5 vehicles produced. Roger Penske in 1964 Nassau won the Nassau Trophy Race against the infamous 427 Ford Cobra. Hagerty Insurance appraises the vehicle at 8 million each. The End!


