

NCM BASH 2023 & CARAVAN 2024 PLANNING TRIP

For 10 years, Ingrid and I have been attending the National Corvette Museum Bash. Most trips have included running the Caravan route that Randy and I have laid out for an upcoming Caravan. The Bash originated in 1997 as the C5 Birthday Bash set up by the C5 Registry and then became the C5/C6 Bash with the introduction of the C6. When Michelin became a major sponsor, the event was renamed to The Bash. Today the Bash is an annual 3-day event in late spring. New Corvette models, colors, and options are displayed, vendors show their newest offerings, technical sessions with GM personnel are offered, food from vendors and at the Stingray Grill can be enjoyed, and NCM volunteer led cruises (including lunch stops) can be taken.

For this year's run we again head to Gettysburg, then to Roanoke, VA, Virginia International Raceway, Concord, NC, Kingsport, TN, then on to Bowling Green. Joining Ingrid, Randy, and me will be 2024 Caravan State leaders, Kevin and Georgia Le Blond (NH/VT) David Fournigault and Chrissy Dawson (NY) and Ivan Hines (Eastern Canada.)

We leave on 21 April and pick up Kevin and Georgia at a Dunkin in MA and head for Scranton, PA, our first stop. Along the way we find the apple orchards along I-87 in bloom which leads us to believe spring is coming. After check-in at our hotel and some relaxing, we head out and enjoy a great dinner at the Harvest Specialty Grill and Wine Bar.

Saturday, we head out and stop for lunch at the Middlesex Diner in Carlisle, PA and then take back roads down to Gettysburg. Again, we find acres of apple orchards in bloom and enjoy seeing the trees and early spring flowers in bloom along the way.

In Gettysburg we meet up with Randy and go to the Adams County Winery to discuss bringing a group to tour the winery. We found a new (to us) restaurant, the Mason Dixon Distillery where we had dinner. We will see them again during our 2024 Caravan event.

On Sunday we head out for the Shenandoah Caverns to discuss tours and lunch options plus other details. From there we headed to the White Oak Lavender Farm and Purple Wolf Winery to find out if this would work as one of our suggested lunch stops. They can accommodate about 100 people, have

plenty of parking, and offer wine tastings, beer tastings, cheese and meat plates, and winery tours. This will be one of three lunch stops for the first day of the Caravan. Next we head to the third lunch stop recommendation, the Devils Backbone Brewing Company Outpost Tap Room and Kitchen where we have lunch. Due to the time we will pass running the Blue Ridge Parkway and head directly to the Hotel Roanoke in Roanoke, VA.

The Hotel Roanoke is a great hotel. With over a century of history, it is still well maintained. We enjoyed some libations and dinner. They have valet service and for the second year we were able to park our cars in front of the hotel versus in the general parking or in the valet parking lot.

On Monday we head out for Virginia International Raceway where we discuss with track personnel how to have lunch set up at the track. While there we watch cars on the track and know we will be there next year with *our* cars on the track! We then head on to Concord, NC, and stay at the Embassy Suites. The next day we meet with hotel sales to work out contract details and learn that the banquet room can accommodate placing a car in it – maybe we can get a new E-Ray from Rick Hendrik Chevrolet dealership to be on display during the banquet!

After the sales meeting we go over to Rick Hendrik's facilities to meet with staff to discuss getting tours of Rick's private collection. We will be able to view and will package the tours, some one hour and some half hour in length. We will also be able to purchase lunch and dine in the facility. We will be able to tour the Hendricks Museum (free to the public) and gift shop. We were able to step into the private collection but not walk around. It is quite a impressive! While there we observed pit crews practicing pit stops. Very loud!

From Concord we headed for the Meadow View Resort in Kingsport, TN where we enjoyed dinner in their lounge, discussed more items relating to the Caravan, and then retired early.

On Wednesday we head for Bowling Green taking more rural roads and less highways. We arrive in Bowling Green at 1 pm (we gain an hour due to the time change) and pick up our pre-registration materials at the National Corvette Museum. We then head over to the Holiday Inn on Wilkinson Trace, register and have lunch at Double Dogs, and dinner at Montana Grill (excellent steaks) where we are joined by our New York State Caravan Leaders, Dave and Chrissy, and friends George and Valarie.

During the next 3 days, we met with the Holiday Inn sales to review contracts and discuss needs, we take an NCM led cruise to the Jim Beam American Stillhouse where we tour the complex and I bottled my own personal bottle of Knob Creek with a C7 logo on top. Afterwards, we have lunch at Isaacs located in the Bernheim Arboretum and Research Forest.




Figure 9. Maine Classic Car Museum

NCM Special Exhibits March 10 – Custom CARisma:

The Legendary Creations of Carl Casper. Carl Casper is a car designer and engineer, a racer, a movie car builder, an antique carriage collector and restorer, author, artist, sculptor, entrepreneur, and philanthropist. As a car show producer his record is peerless. For 55 years, from 1963 to 2017, Carl Casper produced, co-produced, or teamed up to produce over 1000 car shows all over the country. Carl's spectacular career and some of his most famous cars will be on display in the *Custom CARisma*:



The Legendary Creations of Carl Casper exhibit at the National Corvette Museum beginning on March 10, 2023. Cars on exhibit will include The Batman Returns Batmobile, Turbo Shark Corvette, Popcorn Wagon, Young American Dragster, 51 Merc "Knight Cruiser", Paddy Wagon, 32 Renegade Deuce and the Cosmic Invader.



Open now is a new on-going exhibit that features Corvette's Vice Presidents of Design beginning with Harley Earl in the 1950s through Mike Simcoe today. The exhibit also reveals the lesser-known stories of those who worked out of the spotlight but were no less influential in creating the lines that would shape the auto industry. Additionally, this exhibit shines a light on the diversity of the individuals responsible for Corvette's iconic design. This exhibit also provides a full overview of the intricate and exciting process of designing a car, from sketches and renderings to clay and prove-out models.
