

NE CARAVAN FINGER LAKES REGION MEET & GREET

A trip to the Finger Lakes Region in New York was the 4th Meet and Greet leading up to the 2024 New England Caravan. The event was coordinated by David Fournigault and Chrissy Dawson (2024 New York State Leaders) with the assistance of Randy Flock. Well done! A total of 61 cars signed up for the long weekend making this the most well attended Meet and Greet thus far.

Initially we had 6 Gate City Corvette Club cars signed up to attend the event. Several days prior to leaving, I received a call from Dave Sutherland, a new member of our club, asking if it was possible for him and Linda to go along. I said we were glad to have them and looked forward to meeting them. Of the 7 cars, 2 headed out to Horseheads, NY on the Monday of the event week – Kevin and Georgia LeBlond and Jerry Ellner. On Thursday, 4 cars departed together - Osgoods, Sutherlands, Woods, and Goelz. Larry and Heather Shields make a side trip to Amherst, Massachusetts and joined us for the evening dinner in Horseheads.

The "Thursday" cars met in Milford, NH and headed out to Brattleboro, Vermont with Norm leading and me taking the rear. We picked up Route 9 to Troy, NY and then I-87 to I-90 to I-88, and I-86. 

NCM Special Exhibits: Closing soon - Custom CARisma: The Legendary Creations of Carl Casper Carl Casper is a car designer and engineer, a racer, a movie car builder, an antique carriage collector and restorer, author, artist, sculptor, entrepreneur, and philanthropist. As a car show producer his record is

peerless. For 55 years, from 1963 to 2017, Carl Casper produced, co-produced, or teamed up to produce over 1000 car shows all over the country. Carl's spectacular career and some of his most famous cars will be on display in the *Custom CARisma: The Legendary Creations of Carl Casper* exhibit at the National Corvette Museum beginning on March 10, 2023. Cars on exhibit will include The Batman Returns Batmobile, Turbo Shark Corvette, Popcorn Wagon, Young American Dragster, 51 Merc "Knight Cruiser", Paddy Wagon, 32 Renegade Deuce and the Cosmic Invader.





Open now is a new on-going exhibit that features Corvette's Vice Presidents of Design beginning with Harley Earl in the 1950s through Mike Simcoe today. The exhibit also reveals the lesser-known stories of those who worked out of the spotlight but were no less influential in creating the lines that would shape the auto industry. Additionally, this exhibit shines a light on the diversity of the individuals responsible for Corvette's iconic design. This exhibit also provides a full overview of the intricate and exciting process of designing a car, from sketches and renderings to clay and prove-out models.

NEWENGLAND CORVETTE CARAVAN 2024 UPDATE

NOVEMBER 2023

As we move through 2023, the 2024 Caravan is rapidly approaching (for those of us who are producing it) and we still have several tasks to complete, commitments to get, and reviewing of what has already been put in place. So, again in April 2024 we will follow our route for the 2024 New England Caravan to Bowling Green, KY, checking on the roads we have selected to travel (looking for construction work, etc.), checking that the rest stops are still open, making sure the commitments we have with the hotels, restaurants and attractions are still in place, and working to finalize other items.

If you have forgotten to help support the 2024 Caravan effort by having your license plate included on the Caravan website and in the 2024 NE Caravan Route Book, there is still time for you to do it. See the Sponsor information below. Also, you can support us by purchasing a window decal of the 2024 NCM Caravan logo. Please consider being a sponsor. One update that will be of interest to many of those on the wait list is we have increased the limitation for registrations to 200 and are in the process of moving those on the wait list to the registered list who still want to register and send in the required deposit.

• The 2024 NE Caravan registration is **limited to 200 cars** and at this time is **FULL**. There continues to be a wait list for those who now send in their registration form (do not send in a deposit). The registration form on the 2024 NE Caravan website has the updated form. When there is a cancelation the first person on the wait list will be contacted and if they still want to go on the Caravan, will be requested to send in the deposit and will be placed on the attendees list when their check is received. The New England Caravan Registration Refund Policy: A full refund (less \$15.00) up to 7/15/2024. A 50% refund on your registration fee (less \$15.00) from 7/16/2024 to 8/12/2024. Sorry NO refunds for any reason after 8/12/2024.

NOTE: The wait list as of 1 November has **2** entries – if you did not get on the wait list due to earlier number of entries, submit your Registration Form – there will be more cancellations!!!

NE Caravan Planning Update:

The 2024 NE Caravan will begin in Gettysburg, PA, at the Wyndham Hotel (starting on Thursday 22 August; 2-day minimum stay), departing on Sunday 25 August for Hotel Roanoke in Roanoke, VA (driving on part of the Blue Ridge Parkway), departing on Monday 26 August, the plan is to go to the Virginia International Speedway for laps on the south course and lunch, then on to the Embassy Suites Hotel in Concord, NC, touring Hendrick Private Collection and the Hendrick Museum, departing on 27 August for the Meadowview Resort in Kingsport, TN, departing on 28 August for the Holiday Inn (4 day minimum stay) in Bowling Green, KY, departing on 1 September for Home. Other activities along the route will be identified as we put them together.




