

THE RESTORATION OF MY '79 CORVETTE

I recently rejoined Gate City Corvette Club after taking time off from the club to restore my 1979 Corvette. I had previously joined in 2015 along with my friends Barry and Denise (2017 C7) and Ken and Rhonda (69 C3).

I purchased my '79 around November of 2014 for \$4500. It required a little bit of work to get it roadworthy.





As with most C3s mine had a few issues. The second owner of the car (I'm the fourth owner) had it repainted at Maaco. It was bubbling and peeling everywhere. Then my ignition switch decided to get stuck in the "on" position. After a few weeks of hell, I was able to replace the switch only to find that my directional signals stopped working. I hate chasing vehicle electrical issues! That's when I made the decision to drop out of Gate City and concentrate on fixing some of the problems.

As with most of my projects, one thing leads to another. I was going to just touch up the paint issues but ended up doing all of the bodywork and paint.







Of course I couldn't just stop there. I figured I might as well redo the interior. I finished most of the heavy work by 2022. The interior and paint buffing was pretty much complete by the spring of 2023.





I still have small things that need to be addressed but nothing pressing. She's now at a point where I'm not so embarrassed to have her parked beside all the beautiful Gate City club members' Corvettes!





Fun Facts: New Hampshire License Plates

- The U.S. state of New Hampshire first required its residents to register their motor vehicles and display "registration tags" in 1905. (Massachusetts was the first state to require vehicle registration in 1903.)
- The first registration tag, issued to New Hampshire residents had the number "2" on it. The governor reserved number "1" for himself. Registration back then was \$3.00.
- In 1909, it appeared that motor vehicles were here to stay. The registration fee was increased to \$10 and had to be paid annually.
- The New Hampshire plate has been rotating between green-on-white and white-on green since 1914 to keep track of who had paid the annual registration. There were, however, some years the state didn't bother to change the color pattern, throwing the entire system out of whack.
- Steel shortages during World War I caused New Hampshire to use pressboard plates. During World War II, cars were only required to have a back plate and the year was covered with an updated strip of metal.
- Until 1933, plates were manufactured out of state and made of thick steel with enameled numerals.
- After 1933, production was moved to the New Hampshire Prison in Concord. (Ironic these days considering the state's motto.)
- In 1964, the steel used for making plates was replaced with lightweight aluminum.
- From 1949 to 1979, passenger plates in New Hampshire featured a twoletter code indicating the county in which the vehicle was registered.
 Pictured right is our plate from the 70s with RF for Rockingham County.



- In 1958, the word "SCENIC" was added and centered at the top of the plate with NEW HAMPSHIRE on the bottom.
- In 1971, "LIVE FREE OR DIE" replaced "scenic" and was centered at the top. This was the first use of the state motto on passenger plates. The motto was first introduced on vanity plates in 1970.
- The state motto proved controversial. George Maynard appeared in Lebanon District Court in 1974 and 1975 for covering the motto on his state license plate, which he felt was contrary to his faith. The second time, he was sentenced and served 15 days in jail for refusing to pay the \$75.00 fine. The case led to the U.S. Supreme Court hearing, in which the court sided with Maynard, ruling that the state could not force residents to display the state motto if it was against their moral convictions.
- Most New Hampshire residents take pride in its state motto, "Live Free or Die." The phrase was first written by General John Stark, New Hampshire's famous soldier of the American Revolutionary War.
- In 1987, the Old Man of the Mountain in a circle between the words "New Hampshire" was added.
- Virginia has the most vanity plates in the US, closely followed by New Hampshire. This is most likely due to Virginia's low cost of \$10.00 and New Hampshire's relatively low cost of \$25.00. Tennessee is at \$70.00, California at nearly \$100.00, and Texas charges by the letter and can max out at almost \$200.00.
- The MOOSE PLATE supports conservation and heritage projects in every county of the granite state.


