OUR JOURNEY TO A CORVETTE C8 STINGRAY

AND OVERCOMING MY ATTACHMENT TO OUR CT

It all really started with the press coverage of the then upcoming mid-engine configuration C8 and the hype regarding either it was about time, or it's not a genuine Corvette. In late spring of 2019, we received a call from the National Corvette Museum (we are high on the museum's donor list) saying we could get 2 tickets to the July C8 Reveal being held in Los Angeles CA for a donation of \$500.00 and asked if we were interested. Without hesitation I said yes. In July we flew to Los Angeles and attended the Reveal held in one of the dirigible hangers from WW2 which has since burned down. Seeing the C8 on display, I found the new generation to be impressive, very well engineered, and offered a large range of options. Most in the audience were excited with the new mid-engine C8.

Back home, club members as well as other Corvette friends asked me if I was going to get a C8. My response then and for the next 3 years was I thought the C8 was a great next-generation vehicle, but at my age and the fact that I really loved our 2016 Z06 (we built the engine for it and took Museum Delivery) I would not be ordering one. I also was disappointed that I would have to get on a 'list' and wait a *long time* to get one.

Being the co-captain for the 2024 NE Caravan, I started to think in early 2023 about having a C8 for the Caravan. It wasn't until June or July that I learned from MacMulkin that if I went on the list I would have my order placed within 3-4 months and delivery in early 2024. Thinking about everything, my age, less cargo capacity versus the C7, the fact I was quite happy with the C7, finding all the additional accessories we would need (ceramic brake pads, seat covers, jack pads, strut covers, splash guards, sill protectors, car cover) and dealing with selling the C7, kept me from taking the plunge.

After several months of discussions, Ingrid and I finally decided to put our name onto the C8 Stingray list. Ingrid was still not sure the C8 cargo capacity would meet our travel needs, but we will find out when we do the NCM Bash in April '24. On 28 July we went to MacMulkin, wrote a check for a deposit of \$3,000.00, and became #733 on the *list*. By 11 December we were at #168.

Next step was to configure the C8. It took me 3 months to configure the C7, so I was prepared for this one to take some time as well. On 4 September, I sent in our C8 build information and received order #CXVMZP. This was modified on 1 November and a final change on 15 December. The new one would look similar to our C7.

During this time, I needed to decide when and how to sell the C7. I figured if I waited until the spring its value would decrease so now was the time. I decided to approach MacMulkin, Corvette Mike, and, based on Randy Flock selling his C6 to Carvana, I decided to also look at Carvana and I sold it to them. I was very wary of their total online process, and at every step I wondered if I was doing the right thing. The process, however, worked quite well and I was pleased with the outcome.

Another journey to take was choosing aftermarket options... what would we want to add to the car? I quickly found out there are many sites offering a myriad of add-ons to the C8. I visited many of the sites and reviewed what was being offered and I also asked Norm about what he had found. I planned on adding ground effects (rockers and air splitter), jacking pucks, front strut covers, seat covers, Paint Protection Film, a removable front license plate holder, splash guards, sill plate covers, lower inside door panel protection covers, tow hook, car cover, cargo and floor mats, center console storage box, Nova Stretch for the front end and mirrors, and side vent inserts. I expect there will be a few more items before we are done outfitting the car.

On 30 November I received an email stating our order could be processed that day if I was willing to change the wheels (Q91 was on constraint) and delete the contoured liner package (also on constraint). I declined as we really wanted the Q91 wheels. Then on 14 December I again received an email that stated our order could be placed that day as the Q91 wheels were available. I was asked to review the order, confirm that it is accurate, and agree to have the RIA option removed as it was still on constraint. After several emails back and forth making sure we were in sync, on 15 December I sent an email stating that the order was correct. On December 18, 2023, we received an email from MacMulkin stating "Congratulations, we received your final confirmation, and your order is at status 2000!!!" Now the process of watching the progression through the Status stages begins:




Figure 2 Corvette Production Information

When we went to 3400, we got our VIN# and the target production week was listed as 01/29/2024. Norm Wood sent me the production information which showed that our car was produced on 31 January 2024. He said he had received an email from GM stating his car was shipped. So, I started to look for the same email and maybe try to get a picture of the unloading of the car.

MacMulkin contacted me on 2 February regarding the final price, asked how I was going to pay, and what names were to be on the title. It said that they will contact me when they have information as to when the car should arrive at MacMulkin. On Monday 5 February I picked up the title papers from MacMulkin and proceeded to register the car in New Boston. I also contacted the NCM Insurance group and discussed their insuring the car. As it turns out, the cost to insure the car for one year was about half that of using my current insurance company. Pays to shop around!

On 9 February we went to the Gate City Corvette Club meeting. As we were walking through the field of Corvettes someone said they saw a car with our name on it, to which I replied that our car was still in Bowling Green. I then went over to the desk area on the 2nd floor and asked the person sitting there – "where is our car?" He asked for the order number and after looking at his computer screen said that it was on its way. So much for our car being on the floor. I went to the meeting room, dropped off my notebook then went back out to socialize. Again, someone said a car had our name on it and showed us where it was. *To my surprise (and delight!) there was a Torch Red 2024 Stingray with a sold sign on the dashboard with our name on it!* So much for GM sending an email to tell us the car was on a truck

headed for NH!

I then went over to Tom and Mark and asked if they could have the car ready for delivery on Monday 12 February as on Tuesday we were expecting a possible nor'easter and I wanted the car home before the snow arrived. They said they would try. On Monday morning I received a call from MacMulkin that we could pick up the car after 3 PM. So, at 3 PM on 12 February we were at MacMulkin to pick up the car. First was doing the paperwork along with writing the largest personal check I have ever written. Then on to the vehicle checkout and heading home. Arriving home the car went into the garage. The storm went south but I was pleased we finally had our new C8 home.

Now the work begins. With a pile of aftermarket items on the workbench needing to be affixed to the car, I think I will need an extra pair of hands (Norm) to get the work completed because we will be heading to Bowling Green for the NCM Bash in April! Also, we need to schedule the Spring Mountain Motorsports Park driving school.

Oh, by the way, what fits in a C7 may not fit in the C8. Shortly after we got the car, we headed out to our favorite pizza place and planned on taking a large 15 inch pizza home. Guess what – that box did not fit unless you placed it vertical, which would not be good for the pizza. Plan ahead!

GUIDELINES FOR CORVETTE CARAVANS

Prior to departure:

- Every Caravan needs a leader. The leader is responsible for various details involved in having a successful and safe caravan.
- A starting/departure point must be established prior to the event, whether it is for each day of a road trip, or just a social day trip. This should include the date, time, and location. The start point should be sent out in an email and on the event flyer.



- Arrive with enough fuel in your tank for the trip.
- Begin with a "drivers meeting" at least 10 minutes before departure. At this time the route and destination will be explained.
- If possible, hand out written driving directions to each car. No variations to the route should be made once on the road, as it can be confusing to caravan members further back in the group. (Exceptions would be detours or other unforeseen travel conditions.)
- A method of communicating between caravan members needs to be established. Select a channel on a hand held walkie-talkie. A cell phone list of all caravan members is another good method for communicating, especially on an extended trip.
- One Corvette driver should be selected to be the caravan's designated last car or "caboose". That person is responsible for keeping the leader informed on how well the group is staying together. The caboose must have good communications with the leader, as that is how the caravan will stay together by adjusting speed and/or allowing for heavy traffic.
- Any planned fuel, rest, or food stops should be communicated before departure. Any unplanned stops will be worked out by the leader and back caboose, and hopefully can be arranged far enough ahead that all cars without communications will be able to stay with the group.
- It can be very difficult to safely keep a caravan together in heavy traffic, congested areas, and on major highways. If the group becomes separated, plan to regroup when that part of the trip is over.
- With a large caravan of 15 20 or more cars, consider breaking up into smaller caravans of 8 10 cars with a leader and caboose for each.

• For long trips choose a caravan buddy - in case of breakdowns your buddy will stay with you. Plan on catching up with the group when the problem is resolved.

Once on the road:

- Be courteous to other drivers. THIS IS NOT A RACE OR A CANNONBALL RUN. Obey the laws.
- The leader must do everything possible to insure that the caravan stays together. Try to maintain an even speed to keep the caravan in sight, even in heavy traffic.
- Slower cars belong up front. All Corvettes are fast, but if you have a 4 speed with 4:11 rear, highway speeds aren't your specialty. The cars that need to travel at the speed limit need to be at the front of the Caravan. The speeds in a caravan increase quickly the further away you are from the leader.
- Resist passing other cars in the Caravan.
- If the leader sees, or is notified by the caboose that the caravan has become split up, the leader may pull over at the first SAFE PLACE to do so, and wait for the rest to catch up. As you come to a stop turn your wheels toward the road. The caboose will let the leader know when the group is all together. When the lead and caboose determine the road is clear to pull out, the group will pull out onto the road at the same time.
- Always drive within your personal limitations. You will be provided with directions, lunch stops and destinations should you be separated or have to leave the group. If you get there a little later it won't matter that much.
- Watch out for what is known as the Rubber Band Effect, in which the group gets stretched out and then rebounds quickly. Rebounding quickly is NOT good and causes collision.
- Stay alert. The most common accident is the rear-end collision. Please give the cars around you plenty of room to maneuver. No tailgating and always be prepared to stop quickly.
- For manual transmission (and the wanna-be-manual paddle shifter) cars, don't depend on down shifting to slow the car down while in traffic. By down shifting you do not give the driver behind you any warning that you are slowing down. They might be trying to catch up to the group by speeding up, which is not a good combination. So use your brake lights to warn folks as you down shift.
- In general the rule is to drive right and pass left.
- If you are on an Interstate with two, three or four lanes of traffic, try to change lanes only when it's clear for the group.

- Don't block general traffic. If you are in the left lane and another motorist pulls up behind you wanting to overtake, momentarily move right allowing them to pass. (We certainly don't want to encourage road ragers who are easily angered by a bunch of Corvette owners!)
- Remember that truckers are out there on the highway to earn a living so make sure to leave one lane open at all times. Or in other words...get out of the way fast for your own safety.

Stops along the way:

- Patience is appreciated as the whole group gets in, gets parked, uses the facilities and is ready to hit the road again. With a group of people all things take longer.
- When you enter into a business or a parking lot, the biggest concern is slowing down traffic behind you, so get off the road as quickly as you can. Drive into the farthest spot so the cars behind you can enter as well.
- Most members will prefer to back into their parking spaces because of the risk of damaging the spoiler when pulling in head first and because of the convenience of reforming the caravan upon departure. If there is a concern about getting the caravan safely off the highway, pull to the FARTHEST open spot and park HEAD IN. With double parking rows, pull through if possible so you are in the spot where you can drive straight out.
- DO NOT SWING YOUR DOOR OPEN! Please be cautious of the Corvette parked next to you.

Last but not least:

• Leader: Do not "run off" and leave the group behind – this is your caravan, so take ownership of it, and arrive at your destination as an organized and orderly group. The caravan members expect it of you, and not everyone has the same level of experience or comfort traveling as a group. It is your job to insure that all have a good time and will want to do it again!

Trivia Question Answer

Concept Mid-Engine: The year was as early as 1970 and a concept named XP-882 was shown at the 1970 New York Auto Show. It was powered by a transverse-mounted V8 engine located behind the cockpit. Corvette lead engineer Zora Arkus-Duntov's team started working on the XP-882 in 1968. Two prototypes were built around small-block Chevy engines, with plans for bigblock power and eventually all-wheel drive. The styling group designed a new look that was crisp, edgy, and low slung, yet it looked like a Corvette.

Despite fierce resistance from sales, styling, and engineering, Chevrolet general manager John Z. DeLorean canceled the XP-882 project in August 1969 to pursue making Corvettes more profitable.

Then Duntov learned that Ford was buying Italian carmaker De Tomaso so that it could market the new mid-engine Pantera as a "Ford." Duntov showed Bill Mitchell and Chevy's Chief of Engineering Alex Miar his mothballed XP-882. The decision was immediate: "Get the car into the New York show!" The XP-882 was quickly painted silver and dressed as a show car,




After the overwhelmingly positive reception, DeLorean approved the funds to develop a bigblock, four-speed version of the car.

Mid-engine sports cars were the stuff of small, exotic European carmakers. But between the first Arab oil embargo, a recession, the rotary-engine tangent, and the sales success of the production Corvette, the XP-882—or any other mid-engine Corvette, for that matter— didn't stand a chance. Forward thinking just couldn't overcome bad timing until decades later, with the debut of the production C8 mid-engine Corvette.


