

# GCCC Dinner Cruise on Lake Sunapee 10 September 2025



The nightly dinner cruise lasts 2 hours and is narrated by the ship's Captain, who is extremely knowledgeable about the history and lore of Lake Sunapee and surrounding area. The M.V. Sunapee Lake Queen features two decks of enclosed dining and an open-air walkway around the top deck. Take your pick of location to sip on a refreshing cocktail as you cruise out of Sunapee Harbor, taking in the beautiful New Hampshire scenery. As you dine on a delicious buffet dinner, you will learn about the sites and history of the lake. If nature cooperates, you may even see one of our phenomenal sunsets. Whether you are looking for a unique evening out, celebrating something special, or returning to the lake year after year, it's truly a magnificent experience. The dinner cruise leaves at 6:30 pm from Memorial Day to Labor Day and at 5:30 after Labor Day. The cruise provides for great photo opportunities with amazing sunsets, lighthouses and mountain views. You may want to bring a light jacket or sweater aboard the cruise as it is sometimes breezy on the lake.

Our cruise to dinner will start at the Hooksett Welcome Center Northbound, departing at 3:30 PM, heading north on I-89. We will arrive at the Sunapee harbor where we will begin boarding at 5:00 PM and the ship will sail at 5:30 PM. The dinner cruise will last for 2 hours.

The cost per person (payable on the ship) will be \$61.99, plus beverages, plus 8.5% tax.

Joining the club in 1980 we were on our second president, and, as the first president was a *must attend car* show and other corvette events type of guy, our new president Ed Brown followed suit. We were all young and full of energy and ready for the long haul.

Late in 1980 Carol and I had just met and were looking to find a new adventure together. Well, we attended our first show with my basket-case restored '65 roadster. We received second place and I was hooked from then



on! The shows we attended started on Mother's Day (my first Best in Show) and ran every single week until the snow fell around the time we had our final show at "October Vettes" in the fall.

Our club was the most winning club as a whole on the circuit. We took many Best Club Participation trophies home. Every show we attended had a coordinator of the event and that person kept the Best Club Participation trophy. They had to also write a story of how the event went as the newsletter was our main way of communication with "YOU GOT MAIL" in its infancy. We were a proud club and looked upon by others as the "club to beat" at every show. So, when another club beat us, it was time to put pressure on all members to attend shows to help win Best Club Participation.

Going to these shows was also our cruising together as a group event as the shows were sometimes quite a distance. Rhode Island one week, Maine the next week, Boston Harbor the next week and so on for the entire summer - always stopping for a few drinks and lunch afterwards, but only when we were closer to

home because it sometimes got a little rowdy. Yes, we were a fun club and most clubs wanted to be just like us.



Al's very first Best of Show trophy from 1982. Out of all of his many trophies, this is the one that means the most.







## NÜRBURGRING TAKEOVER

Chevrolet Corvette ZR1X and ZR1 now the fastest cars from an American manufacturer

#### 2025-07-31

The Chevrolet Corvette Z06, ZR1 and ZR1X took over the 12.9-mile Nordschleife circuit where, for the first time in the track's history, an automaker brought three different cars with three non-racecar drivers to record three lap times in a single visit. Three of the Chevrolet engineers who helped develop these cars, and have extensive experience and advanced driving credentials, piloted them during the fast laps, highlighting the depth of talent and performance within General Motors.

The Chevrolet team now has the fastest official laps set by an American manufacturer at the Nürburgring Nordschleife.

America's sports car, unleashed in Germany



Drew Cattell, vehicle dynamics engineer and driver of the Corvette ZR1X. Closed course.

Corvette ZR1X vehicle dynamics engineer Drew Cattell completed a 6:49.275 lap in the electrified all-wheel drive ZR1X and now has the fastest lap time of any non-professional racecar driver at the Nürburgring in the list of official record laps. ZR1 vehicle dynamics engineer Brian Wallace set a 6:50.763 time in the 1,064-horsepower ZR1.

The 670-horsepower Corvette Z06, with the most powerful naturally aspirated V8 ever put in a production car, set a lap of 7:11.826 with vehicle performance manager Aaron Link behind the wheel. "No auto manufacturer has done a Nürburgring lap attempt like this before," said GM President Mark

Reuss. "From development through production, and now at the Nürburgring Nordschleife, the Green Hell, we have clearly shown there is no limit to what our GM engineers and vehicles can accomplish. These are the best Corvettes in history, period."

The new documentary "Homegrown Speed: A Corvette Story" goes behind the scenes and showcases the journey from GM's Milford Proving Ground to Germany, illustrating the intensity and precision of pursuing three lap times with three separate Corvette variants and three different drivers. In addition to the engineers who set the lap times, the film features Reuss, Senior Vice President of Product Programs, Safety, Integration and Motorsports Ken Morris and Corvette Executive Chief Engineer Tony Roma.


