President: David welcomed everyone to the October 10th meeting at Murphy's Taproom.

He gave a recap of the recent trip to the Finger Lakes Region in New York. Highlights were stops at local restaurants and wineries and driving the track at Watkins Glen.



He again thanked the 50th party committee for planning the celebration at the Bedford Village Inn.

The election of Board of Directors (BOD) will take place at the November meeting. Members running for a Board position will be published in the November newsletter. Also, there will be a vote on the Proposed Revision of Bylaws. [A copy of this revised document was sent to members by email October 2nd for review prior to the October meeting.] At the meeting, a discussion was initiated by Larry G. to make a further revision to the Bylaws. He suggested that the Immediate Past President (IPP) who serves one term on the Board following a term as president, not be afforded voting rights. Although, voting rights for the IPP is not clearly stated in the bylaws, the IPP has in the past been granted voting rights during that one-year term. Allie said she felt voting rights should be reserved for board members who are elected to represent the membership, but did not specifically apply this to the IPP. Norm K. talked about the experience the IPP brings to the board. [Note: After the October meeting, the BOD and the Bylaws Committee decided to leave the language in the bylaws as is... no proposed revision to restrict voting rights of the IPP during the one term on the Board following presidency.]

Larry is attempting to arrange a raffle of the old GCCC brick which was at the entrance of the Museum. The club purchased a new one earlier in the year to replace the original which had worn.

Officer at Large: Norm W. did not have news about Corvette shows as the season is winding down.

Vice President/Activities Director: Kevin said the Caravan reunion at Attitash was a great success. The weather and foliage were perfect. He mentioned a possible end of season cruise.

Tickets were not available for the 50/50 or member raffles this month.

FALL RECIPES

LIBBY'S® Pumpkin Cranberry Bread | LIBBY'S®

3 cups all-purpose flour

1 tablespoon plus 2 teaspoons

2 teaspoons baking soda

11/2 teaspoons salt

3 cups granulated sugar

1 can (15 ounces) LIBBY'S® 100% Pure Pumpkin

4 large eggs

1 cup vegetable oil

1/2 cup orange juice or water

1 cup sweetened dried, fresh or frozen cranberries

pumpkin pie spice

Combine flour, pumpkin pie spice, baking soda and salt in large bowl.

Grease and flour two 9 x 5-inch loaf pans.

Combine sugar, pumpkin, eggs, oil and juice in large mixer bowl; beat until just blended.

Add pumpkin mixture to flour mixture; stir well until moistened.

Preheat oven to 350° F.



Fold in cranberries. (I use dried.) Spoon batter into prepared loaf pans. Bake for 60 to 65 minutes or until wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pans on wire racks for 10 minutes; remove to wire racks to cool completely. Recipe makes two loaves.

FOR THREE 8 x 4-INCH LOAF PANS: Bake for 55 to 60 minutes.

FOR FIVE OR SIX 5 x 3-INCH MINI-LOAF PANS: Bake for 45 to 50 minutes.

3-4 medium apples peeled, cored, diced (prefer Cortland)

2 tbsp sugar (brown or white)

1/2 tsp vanilla extract

I tsp ground cinnamon

I egg (beaten) for egg wash

A handful of sliced almonds

confectioners' sugar

Apple Puff Pastry Braid

Preheat oven 400 F. Line baking sheet with parchment paper.

Roll out puff pastry into rectangle.

Toss the diced apples with sugar, vanilla extract and cinnamon.



Cut diagonal strips along both long sides of pastry leaving the center intact for the filling. Spoon apple mixture down the center of the pastry. Fold the strips over filling alternating sides to create braid.

Brush pastry with egg wash and sprinkle with sliced almonds.

Bake 25-30 minutes until golden and crisp.

Sprinkle with confectioners' sugar before serving

Enjoy topped with a scope of vanilla ice cream. YUM!

PINK CORVETTE STINGRAY PACE CAR

"MAKING STRIDES AGAINST BREAST CANCER"

Chevrolet is showing its support in the continued fight against breast cancer with the return of a specially-themed pink Corvette Stingray that will serve as the official pace vehicle for the upcoming NASCAR Cup Series races at Talladega Superspeedway and Martinsville Speedway. This season, Chevrolet will celebrate 15 years of supporting the American Cancer Society and its "Making Strides Against Breast Cancer" initiative.

"Chevrolet stands with the American Cancer Society's efforts to end breast cancer," said Todd Christensen, Director, Motorsports Marketing & Activation, for Chevrolet. "When the pink Chevrolet Corvette Stingray pace car leads the NASCAR Cup Series field for the next two weeks, we hope fans will join us in raising funds for ACS by participating in 'Making Strides Against Breast Cancer' events across the US this October."

The specially-themed pink pace car will once again help drive donations for the "Making Strides Against Breast Cancer" initiative with every caution lap it completes in the Talladega and Martinsville races for NASCAR's premier series generating a donation of \$500 (up to \$25,000). A special addition has been added to this year's campaign with Chevrolet pledging to donate an additional \$1,500 (up to \$25,000) for each Team Chevy driver that earns a top-10 finish in the two participating events.

In 2024, 54 total caution laps were completed among the two races - raising a \$18,900 donation for the American Cancer Society. The pink Chevrolet Camaro SS pace car that participated in last year's campaign is set to be auctioned off at the Barrett-Jackson Scottsdale Fall Auction Friday, October 17, with 100% of the hammer price benefitting the American Cancer Society.

The first of two races in this year's campaign will take place at Talladega Superspeedway, with the pink Corvette Stingray making its on-track debut for the NASCAR Cup Series YellaWood 500 on Sunday, Oct. 19 – the penultimate race of the Round of Eight.

The new 66,000-square-foot Collections facility, set to open in Fall 2026, will serve as the future home for some of the world's most important historic Corvettes, Corvette artifacts, and Corvette preservation efforts. Meet the 2029 Corvette Caravan Chairman: Jeffrey Duda

The Corvette Caravan is a nationwide, enthusiast-led road tour held every five years to coincide with the National Corvette Museum's anniversary celebration, uniting thousands of Corvette owners as they travel to Bowling Green, Kentucky, in honor of America's Sports Car.

Jeffrey Duda attended his first National Corvette Caravan in 2003 and has since played active roles in each Caravan, as Chairman, Co-Captain, and Captain. For 2029, Jeff has been named the National Chairman for Corvette Caravan and will be working with Captains from across the country to coordinate the event. Jeff is a Lifetime Member of the National Corvette Museum and resides in Hainesport, NJ. He is an active member of The Original Garden State Corvette Club, and the Original Owner of a 2004 Le Mans Blue Commemorative Edition Z06, and a 2019 Shadow Gray Coupe. Jeff is also known as the host of Zipity's Garage YouTube Channel, a Corvette-focused lifestyle channel.

New to the Collection: 1960 Corvette



General Motors produced over 10,000 Corvettes in 1960, but only 766 of them were Horizon Blue. This color was offered for just one year before being replaced by Jewel Blue in 1961. The 1960 model year was also the last time the Corvette featured heavy grille teeth in the front and taillights that were inset into the rounded rear fenders. This car still has its original 283 cubic inch, 230 horsepower engine and a four-speed manual transmission.

The previous owner of this Corvette, Tim Zradicka, purchased the car around 2004. From 2009 to 2011, he completed a full, frame-off restoration. During this restoration, Zradicka discovered a gas station receipt from 1973 in a defroster duct, aiding his research into the Corvette's history and past owners. With the restoration complete, this car is a great example of Corvette's styling at the dawn of the 1960s.







